



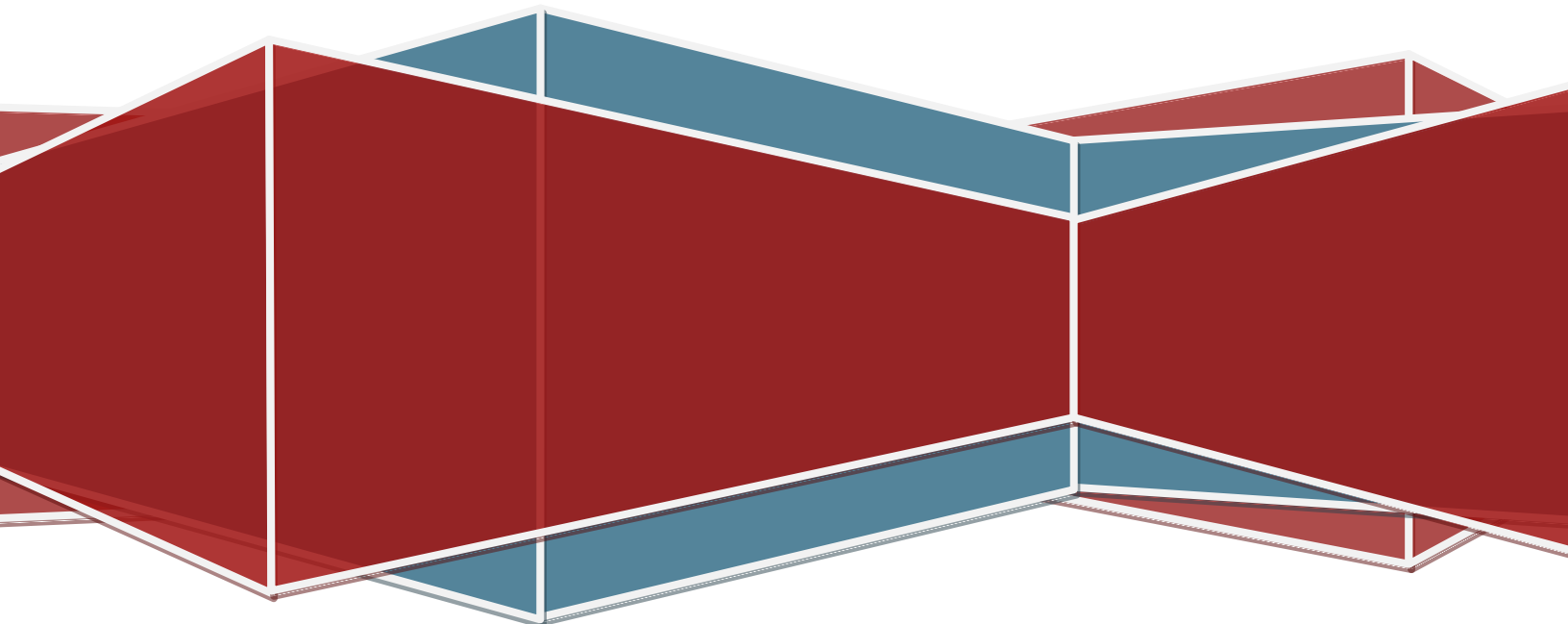

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## ACTIVITIES:

### 1. WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY 2021:

Every year May 31<sup>st</sup> is observed as World No Tobacco Day (WNTD), highlighting the health and other risks associated with tobacco use and advocating for effective policies to reduce tobacco consumption. This year, the theme of World No Tobacco Day 2021 is “Commit to Quit”.

In order to raise awareness about tobacco cessation and encourage tobacco users to quit tobacco, CHIP Foundation in collaboration with Addressing Smokeless Tobacco Use and Building Research Capacity (ASTRA), University of York, UK funded by NIHR and Strategic Institute for Public Health Education and Research (SIPHER), Chandigarh has organized a webinar on ‘COMMIT TO QUIT’ on WORLD CANCER DAY 1<sup>ST</sup> June, 2021.

The outcome of the virtual event was that Delegates from many countries participated in this webinar. They have been sensitized with very important aspects of Smokeless Tobacco: Why does it need special attention, SLT prevalence and challenges in quitting. Panel discussion was also held on the topic: Impact of implementation on Cessation Programmes, Pack Warnings, Mass Media, Advertising bans and Taxation on quitting and Commit to Quit Smokeless tobacco- Challenges to effective implementation of tobacco Control policies in South East Asia.




## 2. VIRTUAL PROGRAM ON WOMEN AND HEALTH:

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## **5. ASTRA-ECONOMICS STAKEHOLDER EVENT**

CHIP Foundation on behalf of ASTRA Team hosted ASTRA Economics Stakeholder meeting on 30th Sep 2021 timing 1600 – 1800 hours.

### **Purpose:**

As one of the four primary research studies within ASTRA, the purpose of the ASTRA-Economics study was to estimate the lifetime economic burden of ST use with respect to healthcare costs and health impacts in Bangladesh, India and Pakistan.

### **Why this stakeholder event?**

ASTRA research is co-created with stakeholders, thanks to their inputs in all stages of the studies. The results of the Economics study are now available but we would like relevant stakeholders to review these findings and inform the design of our dissemination strategies.

### **What is the agenda of the event?**

This event is expected to be interactive so that stakeholder inputs can be incorporated in the final dissemination of ASTRA Economics findings. In addition, we will ask the attendees to consider what needs to be prioritised to strengthen smokeless tobacco control in the three study countries and beyond. Brunel University London colleagues will make a short presentation of the findings (20 min). Participants will then go to breakout rooms (one per country) to discuss key issues, including testing of key modelling assumptions and the results (30 min). This will be followed by a plenary feedback and discussion session (20 min). In the next phase of the event, participants will be allocated to breakout rooms and asked to prioritise the aspects of the model/findings for dissemination purposes, including guidance for policy briefs (20 mins). Finally, the organisers will wrap up the event by summarising the action points and the next steps (10 mins).

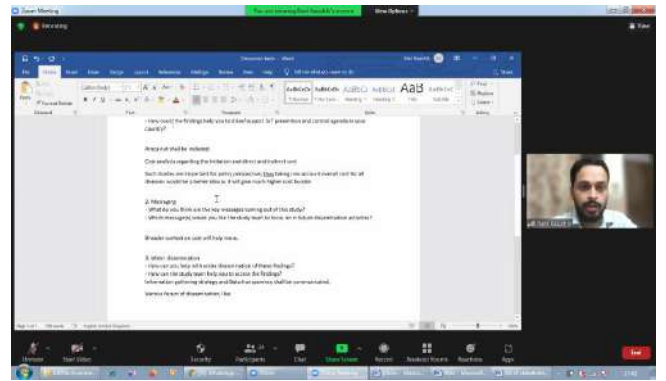
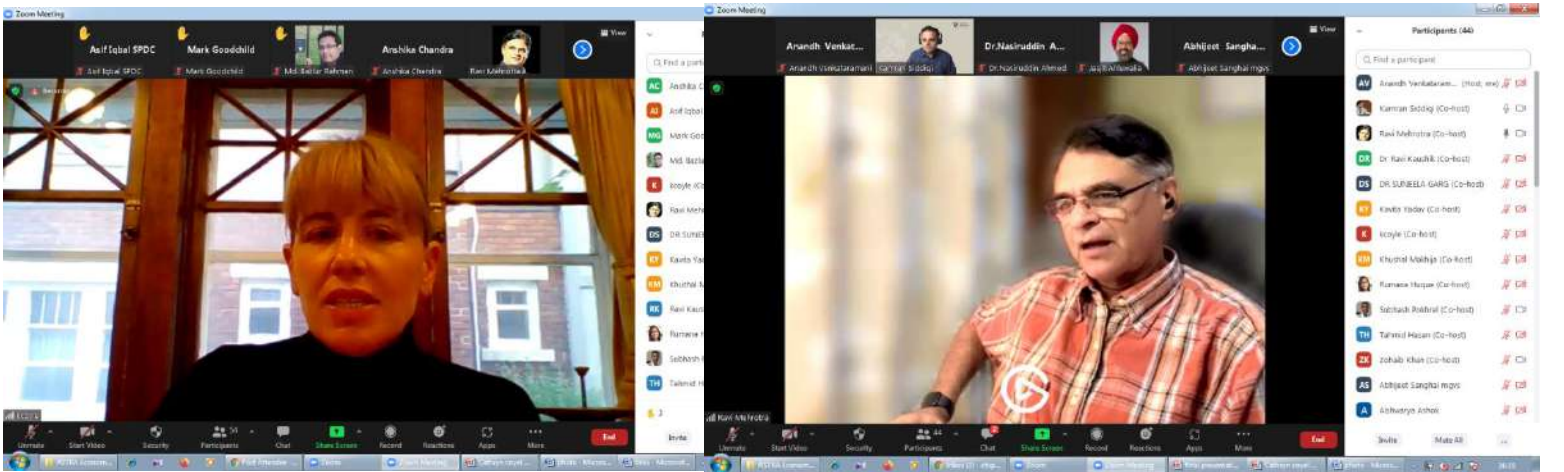

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## **6. VIRTUAL CERTIFICATE COURSE ON MANAGEMENT OF COMMON CANCERS (ORAL, BREAST AND CERVIX)**

### **Introduction:**

India is witnessing a rapid health transition with a rising burden of Non-Communicable Diseases. The country is also witnessing growth in cancer cases.

In order to prevent and control major NCDs, the National Programme for Prevention and Control of Cancer, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases and Stroke (NPCDCS) was launched. The programme focuses on strengthening infrastructure, human resource development, health promotion, early diagnosis, management and referral.

It has been observed that through this programme NCD clinics are being set up at District and CHC levels, to provide services for early diagnosis, treatment and follow-up for common NCDs. Provision has been made under the programme to provide free diagnostic facilities and drugs for patients attending the NCD clinics.

### **About the Course:**

This virtual certificate course on three common cancers in India Oral, Breast and Cervix (OBC) is designed to strengthen the NPCDCS, especially in remote areas. This course will offer lectures by eminent faculty covering various topics on OBC cancer screening along with interactive sessions and live demonstration on different methods of screening. This course will provide a basic understanding of three preventable cancer screening in India.

### **Educational Objectives of the course:**

- The course will also focus on health promotion through behaviour change with the involvement of the community, civil society, community-based organizations, media etc.
- How to arrange outreach Camps for opportunistic screening at all levels in the health care delivery system from sub-centre and above for early detection of common cancers.
- The course also envisaged building capacity at various levels of health care for prevention, early diagnosis and treatment of cancer.
- Provide support for diagnosis and cost-effective treatment at primary, secondary and tertiary levels of health care.

### Who should apply?

- MBBS, BDS, MDS, MPH, M.Sc, MSW, Paramedical staff inclined to take up public health as a career professional working in research.
- Access to and use of computers is a core requirement.
- The functional level of knowledge of spoken and written English.
- Recommendation letter from Head of the Department / Senior.

**Course Fee:** The course was absolutely free of cost.

### Virtual Platform:

The virtual platform used for this course is Zoom. Selected candidates will be given a trial run facility before the course starts.

### Outcome:

As an outcome, an MoU has been signed between CHIP Foundation and BALCO Medical Research, Raipur regarding teaching and training purpose of medical, nursing and technical students and doctors. No finance is involved in the whole venture.



On 4<sup>th</sup> October, 2021 course was conducted.

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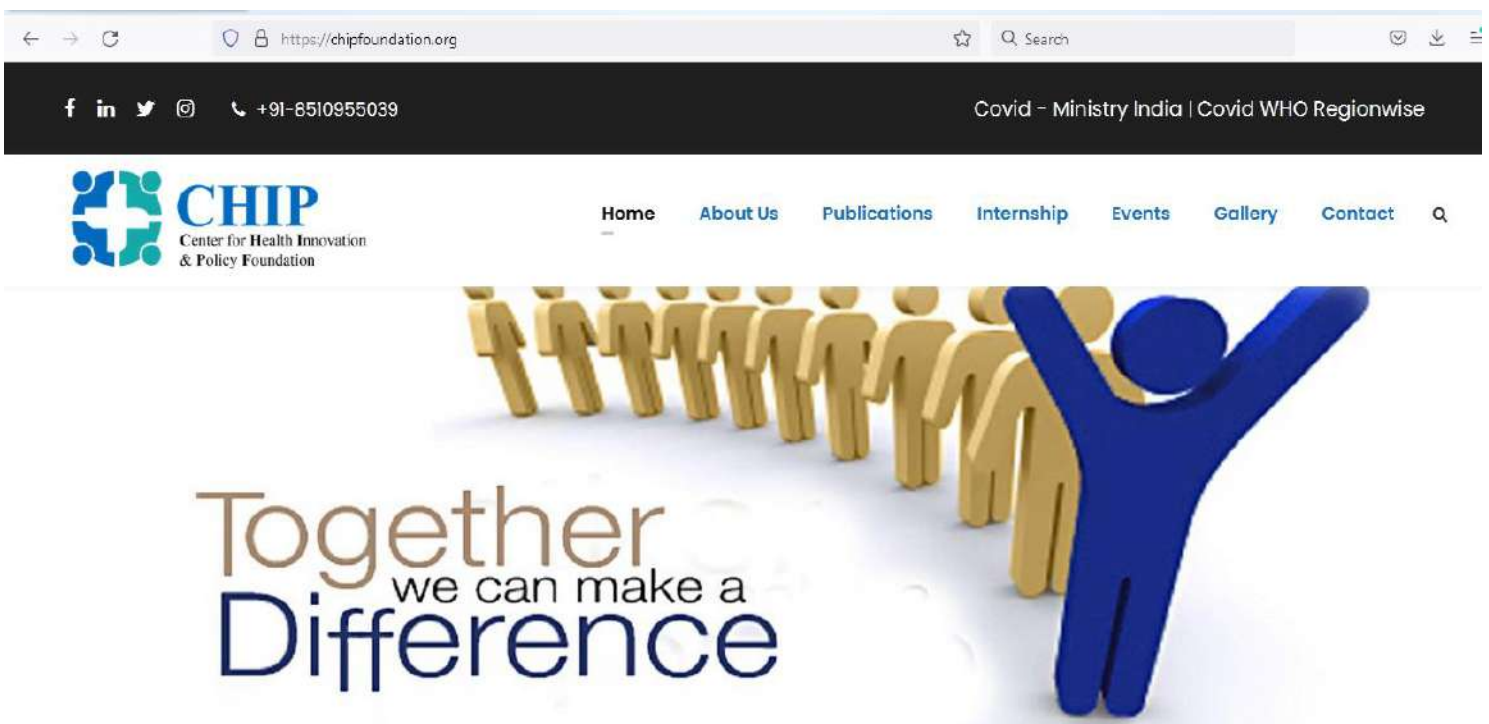
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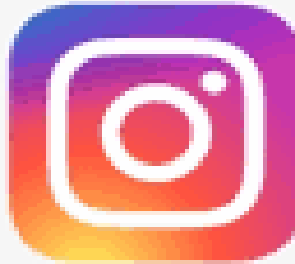
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
